The CHAPLAIN'S Corner

And he said: "Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked shall I return there. The LORD gave, and the LORD has taken away; blessed be the name of the LORD."

JOB 1:21

"Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked shall I return. The Lord gave, and the Lord has taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord." Job 1:21

I was listening to a podcast on the book of Job as I traveled and I passed a sign on a business that stated, "His Way, His Will." That provoked further thinking on the subject of our submission to God and His perfect will in our lives. Job is subjected to a series of events including the death of his children and the demise of his farm and businesses.

Even one of the events Job experienced would bring us to our knees. Never the less, even with the encouragement of his friends to curse God, Job persisted stubbornly and faithfully to trust God. Job's story humbles me. The smallest challenge affecting my family or friends can place me in a tailspin. Anxiety seems to precede faith.

Another Old Testament account of trusting God, that of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abendego, the three faithful Hebrew men who defied King Nebuchadnezzar, also serves as a testament to faith in God. After refusing to worship the golden calf constructed by the king, King Nebuchadnezzar 11, the men were subjected to death in a fiery furnace. They persisted in their faith proclaiming the God they served was able to deliver them! The account of their time in the fire finds them visibly accompanied by a fourth party. Even though the men casting them in the fire were killed by the heat of the flames, the Hebrew men were unharmed.

My prayer is that my trust is in the boundless wisdom and love of Christ. My prayer is that I'm released from the mistaken belief that there is any God before our God. Amen.
