Wishing Well Program

In the 2007 hit movie, *The Bucket List*, two terminally ill patients (Jack Nicholson and Morgan Freeman) set out on an adventure to accomplish several tasks before they die. Their journey is marked by the fulfillment of many dreams.

Patients facing terminal illnesses may have unrealized wishes they would like to achieve. In response to this need and in an effort to help patients achieve more peace, we have created the “Wishing Well” program.

This program is designed to assist with granting final wishes for our patients. Developed in April of this year, this program is supported solely through donations and fundraisers. A yard sale was held in May, 2016, to support this program, resulting in over \$600.00 being raised. Eligible individuals are identified by a care team member and referred to the Wishing Well Committee for review.

Wishes are granted based upon policy guidelines and on a case-by-case basis. “As your hometown hospice provider, we are excited about this new opportunity,” says CEO, Kristina Leyden.

Hospice Care involves a team approach. Dignity, respect, comfort, and quality are the foundations of the Richmond County Hospice Team. Our Nurses and Hospice Aides serve as vital members of our team as they provide frequent, direct, hands-on care to our patients. Hospice Nurses work closely with physicians and are actively involved in developing and following a plan of care which is tailored to the patient's individual need for pain management and symptom relief. Hospice Aides work under the supervision of the Registered Nurse to provide assistance with personal care for our patients. Richmond County Hospice is confident in saying that our nurses and aides consistently provide compassionate, quality, end-of-life care. The week of May 6-12 was recognized as National Nurses week, and the week of June 9-16 was recognized as Nurse Assistant week. We are thankful for our nurses and aides and celebrate the important work that they do.

Nurses and Aides at the Haven

Here at the Haven, we have an awesome team of caregivers compiled of nurses and aides. We have seven full-time nurses and six full-time aides. Together, we provide exceptional care for our patients who are either guests for GIP reasons or for a respite stay. Two of our nurses are certified in Hospice and Palliative care. Not only do we provide medical care, but also emotional support for patients, friends, and family members. This team takes pride in our facility, services provided, and maintaining comfort and dignity throughout a person's visit. We are honored to have the opportunity to take part in an individual's transition, while providing support for the patient and family as a whole. Chaplain's Corner

Hello, my brothers and sisters in Christ! I pray that the peace of God be with each of you every day. I want to share about the glory of God and our purpose in this life. I can't stress the importance of us grasping this! Learning this will bring you peace as you have never known.

LIGHT OF LIFE SPRING 2016



The Bi-Annual Light of Life Memorial Celebration was held on Tuesday, May 17th at 6:00pm at the Church of God of Prophecy in Hamlet. This Bi-Annual event is held as a remembrance ceremony for families served by Richmond County Hospice, Inc. who lost a loved one over the past six months. Families of our community are also invited to attend. The evening gave families a time to celebrate the lives of those no longer with them. During the service, family members took part in a reflection ceremony by lighting a candle to commemorate the life of the deceased loved one. In addition, families enjoyed special music and an inspiring message by Pastor Crews. Following the memorial celebration, Richmond County Hospice, Inc. hosted a catered dinner in the church's fellowship hall.

Richmond County Hospice, Inc. recognizes that grief can often times create a dark and sad place for individuals to overcome.
