

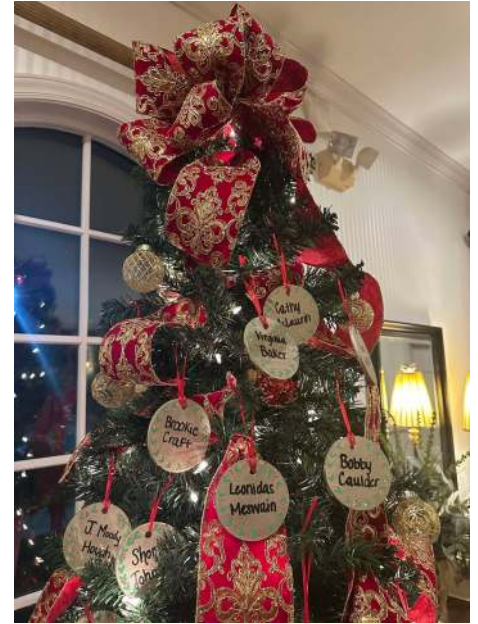


Anson County Hospice Forever Tree Lighting Service

National Care at Home Month Proclamation – November 2024

WHEREAS, for more than half a century, care at home has supported millions of patients nationwide, allowing them to recover from acute illness or injury, navigate activities in their daily lives, or spend their final months at home, surrounded by loved ones;

WHEREAS, home care offers a person-centered approach to treatment, including expert medical care, quality symptom control, and comprehensive pain management as a foundation of care;

WHEREAS, beyond providing physical treatment, home care improves the quality of life for patients by allowing them to remain where they'd most like to reside and in the case of hospice, attends to patients' emotional, spiritual, and family needs;

WHEREAS, in addition to helping patients, home care provides support, respite, and in some cases, counseling services, to patients' families and loved ones;

WHEREAS, in an increasingly fragmented and difficult-to-navigate medical system, home care is one of the areas of healthcare that demonstrates how care can – and should – work at its best for its patients, offering a full continuum of services;

WHEREAS, millions of Americans recovering from acute illness or injury or living with serious or life-limiting illnesses and their loved ones receive care from home care, hospice, and palliative care providers in communities throughout the United States each year;

WHEREAS, home care organizations are advocates and educators about advance care planning that helps individuals make decisions about the care they want and empowers them to be the architects of their care plan;

WHEREAS, the central philosophy of home care puts patients first, ensuring a coordinated and person-centered approach to care, protecting patient choice and access to individualized services based on a patient's unique care needs and wishes.

WHEREAS, care at home is a valuable resource that should be available for all Americans and their loved ones.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that I, Amy H. Guinn, Mayor by virtue of the authority vested in me by Hamlet, NC, do hereby proclaim November 2024 as **National Care at Home Month** and encourage citizens to increase their understanding and awareness of home, hospice, and palliative care, discuss their healthcare wishes with their families, and observe this month with appropriate activities and programs.

Richmond County Hospice had our tri-annual CHAP re-accreditation survey in November.

The surveyor was on site for 5 days looking at our processes, policies, meeting minutes, patient charts, touring and inspecting the Haven, making home visits with our staff, and reviewing all aspects of the services we provide. We are very proud to say that at the end of her on-site survey, our surveyor informed us **we had a deficiency free survey!**

On January 6, 2025, CHAP officially awarded us with our Accreditation.

Richmond County Hospice, Inc. provides a variety of hospice services to patients and their families in Richmond County and surrounding areas. Richmond County Hospice, Inc. is the only nonprofit, independent, community-based hospice in Richmond County, and will be celebrating 40 years of service in 2025.

CHAP is an independent, not-for-profit, accrediting body for community-based health care organizations. Created in 1965, CHAP was the first to recognize the need and value for accreditation in community-based care. CHAP is the oldest national, community-based accrediting body with more than 9,000 agencies currently accredited nationwide. Through "deeming authority" granted by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), CHAP has the regulatory authority to survey agencies providing home health, hospice, and home medical equipment services, to determine if they meet the Medicare Conditions of Participation and CMS Quality Standards. CHAP's purpose is to define and advance the highest standards of community-based care.

This is a great accomplishment for all the staff at Richmond County Hospice. We would like to thank our amazing employees for not only the hard work that they put into every day taking care of patients and their families, but for those who work tirelessly behind the scenes as well! What a blessing for us to care for our community with hearts of compassion.
