This year our Creativity Coordinator chose the Story of the Birth of Christ as the theme for our parade entry. Our float played out the story of that Special Night beginning with the heavenly hosts spreading the good news followed by the angel proclaiming Christ's birth, down to a meek stable where our King was born, shepherds were visiting the new arrival at the manger, and walking along behind the stable were the Wisemen following the star on a journey to find the newborn King.

The bigger aspects of the float were visible for all to see but hidden among the entry were some smaller details that played major parts in Jesus earthly journey. Many of which we hope you will be able to find in the pictures here.

Beside the majestic angel perched on the railing was a white dove signifying the peace that Jesus brings. Our female Shepherd was holding a bouquet of lilies which is often a symbolic reference to Christ's resurrection, new beginnings, and hope. Included in the architectural design of the stable was a cross located above the trough where the baby Jesus laid representing the future sacrifice that Baby would become for the whole world. The male Shepherd was holding a sheep representative of the "Good Shepherd" and the fact that we are all His sheep and that He is willing to leave the 99 to search for the one lost sheep. Behind Mary was a thorn bush symbolic of the crown of thorns worn by Jesus at the time of His crucifixion and the pain and agony he suffered through for our sins. Near Mary's feet was a basket containing loaves and fishes a representation of the story of Jesus feeding the thousands with just 2 fishes and 5 loaves of bread and the many other miracles He would perform.

We thank the Hamlet Christmas Parade committee for their hard work to provide such a joyful evening. We greatly appreciate our dedicated cast of employees and volunteers that brought this miraculous story to life, we couldn't have done it without each one of you. 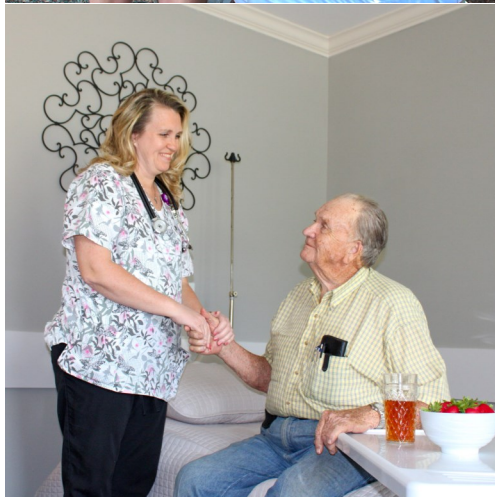
